## Crisp Recycling Project

As you may know in September Westwood C.P. began to collect crisp packets as part of the recycling project that will support the 'Never Forget Fund' at Chester Zoo! We are working with a Year 11 pupil at the Elfed who inspired us to do our bit, not only for the environment as crisp packets currently go into landfill or into our waterways, but to help the Baby Asian Elephants who have contracted the deadly disease EEHV.



So how does the recycling scheme work?

Terracycle will take the crisp packets. They will recycle them and donate a 1p to a charity of our choice - we are donating to the Never Forget Fund at Chester Zoo.

The Never Forget Fund is helping the research for treatments and equipment to save the baby Elephants from the deadly virus EEHV! For every recycled crisp packet, Chester Zoo's Never Forget Fund get 1p. So far, we have collected over 600 crisp packets! So, please keep them coming- the Elephant bin is in the foyer! Together we can make a difference- there is no Planet B!

We had the most amazing meeting of the Buckley Plastic Reduction Forum at Westwood Community Primary on the 18th September- Hayley and Vicky were there from Given To Shine showing us reusable sanitary products and nappies. Fantastic! And they aim to give every girl in Y5 and 6 ten of these pads which last 10 years...they are so passionate about what they do. Westwood Community Primary School are the first primary school in Flintshire to be part of this amazing scheme tackling sustainability and period poverty! If you like what you see and hear about Given To Shine, there's a fund raising rock night at the Tiv on Oct. 25th.

At the meeting we also looked at hosting workshops to make beeswax wraps, litter picking and the crisp packet collection scheme which is really taking off at Westwood Community Primary, and from the 23rd September the school will be a collection point for the community! We had so much to discuss plus lots of great ideas to help you become plastic free!

There was so much energy and enthusiasm - don't get left behind, our next meeting is **Nov. 20th** at 6.30pm at Westwood Community Primary-there will be free refreshments too! ## In Memory of Joanne Griffiths

Dear Parents, Carers and Friends of Westwood,

As you will know, during the Summer holidays we lost one of our amazing staff members, who suddenly and tragically passed away, our Joanne.

Joanne was only 39 years old. It is a tragedy on so many levels for the people she has left behind. She was a devoted young mum of two young boys aged 11 and 6, she was a partner, a daughter, a sister and a friend. She meant so much to so many people.

Whilst Jo was part of our team, she struck up many friendships and was a good friend to many of our staff. Jo was always full of life. Always smiling - she truly had a heart of gold. She doted on her boys and even they would sometimes make an appearance at Westwood to help their mum with her role at school.

Her funeral took place last week at Bistre Church. I know that for the hundreds that attended and for those who could not, the amazing legacy that Joanne left behind was there for all to see. It was a beautiful service for a beautiful soul. I know that up to the time of the funeral many, many of our Buckley community gave such comfort to Jo's family in the saddest of times through their thoughts, prayers, words and deeds.

We will always remember Jo as the kindest of girls, who would put her boys first and would always help another if she could. She was a wonderful person and she will always be part of our Westwood family. She will never be forgotten. God bless you Jo - we will all miss you so much at Westwood.

Flintshire County Council now has an account for residents and customers to enable them to access a number of services online.

If you would like to register your child for a school place, check when your bin will be collected or get the contact details for your local councillor on-line, the Council's new My Account is just what you need and you can do it all at a time and place that suits you best.

It's quick and easy to sign up. Go to <u>flintshire.gov.uk/My-Account</u> and register for My Account now!

Over the coming months, the Council will be extending the services available to Flintshire residents through My Account and it will keep you posted as new things come online.

By creating an online account, the information you provide will feed into a centralised system allowing us to process your request much quicker.

If you would like some help getting started, you can go along to one of the Council's Connect Centres and they will be able to help set you up.
