We have been busy in school since our return and you have been appreciative of the communication and updates since we came back to school. Our main focus has been working with your children to restore and maintain their positive wellbeing over the last 4 weeks since their return. The teachers and staff are also establishing their recovery within Literacy and Numeracy curriculum too. A lot of hard work is taking place, alongside ensuring our children are safe, happy and well in school. Your support with online learning and homework is very much appreciated too – we know just how much you appreciate our efforts, are enjoying having your children back in school and enjoying the routine too! A huge welcome too, to all of our new Westwood Families to our Westwood Family!!

We know that your child is enjoying the many aspects of the new 'normal' we have established – Welly Wednesday when they can wear their **own suitable outdoor clothes** for outdoor activities to allow you to catch up with the uniform cleaning mid week. Our Daily Mile is being incorporated with the classes through school. The track was laid in the lockdown thanks to the generosity of one our parents! P.E. kit to be worn on their P.E. days— can I remind you to pop on your school cardigan or sweatshirt over your P.E. kits please? P.E. day isn't an own clothes day. Also I must remind you of our policy on school uniform, which can be found on the website. Many children have returned wearing jewellery; chains, drop earrings and looped earrings which are not allowed due to health and safety – studs and small sleepers are acceptable, which must be removed for P.E. or plasters provided. Long hair should be tied back for Health & Safety reasons. We also have a few children with dyed hair, which we say within the school uniform policy isn't accepted. I understand during lockdown and holidays, we may fancy a change but we must request that now we are back in school, we follow the policies set out which you support as part of the home / school agreement. I thank you for your support here.

A huge well done to many of our parents and carers, who have been wonderful with all of adaptations within our setting and organisation set out in the handbook; especially our morning and home time routines and keeping a safe 2 metre social distance! You are very punctual too and this is helping greatly with the organisation of the day. It is also great to see the traffic outside school has reduced considerably. Many of you are making use of the car parks, which are FREE and those who need to park closer, are parking with more consideration. Unfortunately we still have a few parents / carers who are parking on the pavements, on corners, opposite the school gates and junctions which is unnecessary and unsafe. This is an accident waiting to happen and it is not acceptable; I really do not want any child harmed. Thank you for your continued support with this it is for the safety of your child and the children of our Westwood Family.

I would like to also give a big mention to my amazing staff. Since our return to Westwood, every member of staff has returned with a positive, can do attitude. We are all in it together to ensure your child is well, happy and safe; whilst they are learning and socialising in school. This is no mean feat after 6 months away and it is a joint effort by us all; we all play an important part. My staff's wellbeing and happiness is very important to me too and I thank them for their commitment to Team Westwood and to our Westwood Family.

Finally, thank you too to all the wonderful messages of support and appreciation I have received since our return! I am very lucky to have a brilliant Westwood Family! 

#### Colds / Flu / Covid -19 Communications

If your child is poorly, we ask you let us know they will not be in school. Even if you have told us, and your child attends Penguins, you must let them know too and vice versa. On a couple of occasions, I have been contacted by Penguins who have passed on information. Please keep both settings informed at all times. Thanks:)

Also as cold and flu season is upon us, we have a few children who are absent with colds, sickness bugs etc. I would ask you watch the video that was sent to you to give you advice of the symptoms of colds and Covid. https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=TTDbNz-1F3c&feature=youtu.be

We are clear that the symptoms we consider as Covid are:

- · A new continuous cough
- High temperature
  - You will be aware of this from the correspondence we have sent out and the procedure we will activate if your child presents with these symptoms in school.

Please re read the parent handbook and the risk assessment to be clear of this. We are here to help but this has been outlined on many occasions with the testing procedures available too.

If you, members of your household or your child are presenting with Covid-19 symptoms, please stay at home, book a test online <a href="https://www.nhs.uk/conditions/coronavirus-covid-19/testing-and-tracing/get-a-test-to-check-if-you-have-coronavirus/">https://www.nhs.uk/conditions/coronavirus-covid-19/testing-and-tracing/get-a-test-to-check-if-you-have-coronavirus/</a> or though the 119-phone number.

# If you have booked a test, are considering a test or have been advised by your doctor to call for a test, please do not send you child into school.

Once you have your test results returned, please notify us. Only negative results will allow a return to school, and as long as no one in your home is symptomatic / well enough to attend school. We must keep our school community safe and we will support you if at all possible.



We/my child has travelled and has to self-isolate as a period of quarantine.	Do not take unauthorised leave in term time. Consider quarantine requirements and FCO advice when booking travel. If returning from a destination where quarantine is needed contact school, agree an earliest date for possible return. Minimum of 14 days from return date.	The quarantine period of 14 days has been completed.

#### **Breakfast club**

Breakfast club and Westies Breakfast Club (for Nursery & Reception) are now open for bookings on the School Gateway (Comms) app.

Schoolgateway



All the bookings are to be made on the School Gateway (Comms). Bookings must be made in advance, even if it's the 8.30-9.00 slot. The later time slots of 8.30 to 9.00 are capped at 20 places maximum, booked in advance – this is to keep our numbers conducive for social distancing between contact groups. If you don't already have the School Gateway app, please download it, put in your contact email and telephone number which we have on the school system, this will link you to your child's account. Any problems with this system feel free to contact the office.

#### Online learning resources and home support with reading

If your child is poorly or unable to come into school for whatever reason, we can support you with work. If your child is able to complete work from home, they can do so.

If your child is in Juniors, your child has a blended learning book that was sent home with work on a project to complete. Your child can access Study ladder, Read Theory, My Maths. Spellings for all year groups will be also available on the class pages. You also can read with your child 4 times a week. <u>It is important that regular reading practice is maintained at home for all children to support us with our recovery curriculum.</u>

If your child is in Foundation phase, from Friday you will have access to a learning grid on your child's class page and Seesaw. Your class spellings for Year 1 & 2 will also be on the class pages. Your child can read their reading books 3 times for the week too.

There are lots of further resources on Hwb for Blended Learning, if your child has their password. New nursery and pupils new to school may need help with passwords for the online platforms. Please contact the office who can forward your request for password help to the class teachers from Monday 5th October onwards.

As you know we use school spider for our website communications, and the app helps you to keep up to date with the events of school on the website via a Smartphone / Mobile.

On Wednesday 23<sup>rd</sup> September, we sent out a test smartphone message via the app; this was opened by around 20% of our school community. **We will be sending out another test email on Monday 5th October @ 11am.** To access this test message, you will need the app and you will receive an alert—please open the message!
